Baltimore Yearly Meeting.

* At a sitting of the Yearly Meeting of Friends held in Baltimore, for the Western Shore of Maryland and the adjacent parts of Pennsylvania and Virginia, on the 30th of the 10th Month 1828.

— Hugh Balderston was appointed to serve this Meeting as Clerk, and William Proctor as assistant Clerk.

— The peculiar and tried circumstances, in which this Meeting is placed, being brought under consideration; it was concurred to appoint a committee of Men and Women Friends to prepare and Report to a future Sitting of the Meeting, a Minute containing a suitable expression of our present situation, and the causes producing the same: and the following Friends were accordingly appointed to the service. Mr. Gerard S. Hopkins. Shorthals Worthington. Hugh Balderston. William Proctor. Elizabeth Gillingham. Mary Robinson. and Martha Carey.

— The following named Friends, were appointed to make application on behalf of this Meeting, to the Trustees of Friends who have the care of the Meeting House, in the Eastern District, for the privilege of occupying the same, during the sittings of this Meeting, and were desired to Report to next Meeting. Mr. Nicholas Peplin. Joseph King Jun^r and Union Williams.

— Then adjourned to meet at 3 o'clock this afternoon.

— Pursuant to adjournment Friends again assembled.
