The Committee on Indian concerns report that having received information that our Brethren of the Yearly Meeting of Ohio had appointed a committee to extend assistance to the Indians in that State and had authorized them to ~~assist~~ ^{co-operate with} ^{as may might open} the committees of other Yearly Meetings, we were impressed with the belief that a union of ~~our~~ committees with that of Ohio would be attended with beneficial consequences in the future prosecution of the concerns ^{confided to us,} by enabling us through our Brethren there, to communicate more easily and frequently with the establishments under our care, we therefore instructed the deputation which was appointed by us to visit the Indians at Waupaukannetow ^{creek} & Stony, to pass by the settlement of Friends at Short Creek in the State of Ohio and endeavour to effect ^a union of the committees of our respective yearly Meetings which was accomplished, and a deputation ^{was} appointed by our Brethren there to unite in the visit, who in conjunction with ours performed the service and from whom the following report was recd.
