To the Yearly Meeting now sitting:

We of the Committee appointed respecting spirituous Liquors having met and
weightily considered the Subject, are free to propose that Quarterly ^{and monthly} meetings
be enjoined to continue their labour in the spirit of Love, - endeavouring
to convince those of our Members who distil & trade in that article of
the evil consequences thereof; - And if after Monthly meetings shall
have patiently laboured with those who continue to distil or trade
therein they cannot be prevailed on to decline the practice it is our
Judgment that such meetings be left at liberty to disown them
from Society. -

We are also of the Judgment that it will be right
to recommend to Quarterly and Monthly meetings to continue
to labour in the spirit of Love with those of our Members who
make a common use of ardent Spirits as an article of drink
either in Harvest, or on any other Occasions. - And
likewise with those who are concerned in selling or ginding Grain
for distillation, - or having fruit distilled, or conveying the liquor
when distilled to or from Market; - and to report of their progress
^{in this respect} to next Meeting. - Which we submit to the Meeting
