"We would therefore respectfully and
earnestly implore the two Houses of Congress,
to interpose such powers as they possess, and
save these Aborigines from the injustice and
oppression, which not only threaten their ruin;
but must bring opprobrium and a stain
upon our national Character."

"May that 'Righteousness' which exalts
a nation, influence your deliberations upon
this momentous subject - guide you in the
course you pursue; and confer upon our
highly favoured Country, the continued
remembrance of that Blessing, which He, who
controls and rules Empires and States, can
either give or withhold."

in presenting the same to Congress, as may
appear to be expedient, and report of their
care to next Meeting.

Baltimore the 15th of the 9th month 1830.

Information was now received, thro the medium
of one of the Correspondents for our Yearly Meeting,
that the communication from us, to the
Meeting for Sufferings in London, was duly
and acceptably received by that Meeting.

The attention of the Meeting has, at this
time, been called to the Will of the late
Sarah Fare, of the City of Philadelphia, from
which it appears, that she has devised to the
Yearly Meeting of Baltimore, the sum of Five
hundred Dollars; as also several bequests
to the Meetings within our verge. We are
informed that the legality of this donation
has been contested by her heirs at Law;
and that testimony was about to be taken
by the Circuit Court of the United States, held
in Philadelphia.

As the Representatives of the Yearly
Meeting, during its recess, and that Meetings
not likely to be in Session before the time
for taking testimony, we conclude to place
all papers and documents touching our
claims, in the hands, and under the care
of a Committee, who are instructed, on behalf
of this Meeting, to give such attention to the case
