Extracted from the Minutes of the
Meeting of 1832

OK to the Meeting this year

Then adjourned to the stated time
in the 9th month next.

At a Meeting for Sufferings held in Baltimore the
12th of the 9th Month 1832.

Present 9 Members. The number in attendance not
being sufficient to transact Business — Adjourned to
meet at the close of the Quarterly Meeting — to morrow.

13th of the 9th Month 1832.

According to adjournment Friends met.

Present 10 Members. The absence of so many of the
members of this Meeting it is believed is occasioned
by indisposition in themselves or families or on account
of the prevailing Epidemic; and as the number in atten-
dance is not sufficient to authorize the meeting to
transact business; it was concluded to adjourn to 7th Oct.
on Seventh day evening preceding the Yearly Meeting.

At a Meeting for Sufferings held in Baltimore
— moved by adjournment the 27th of the 10th month 1832

Present Seventeen members and several
brethren from neighbouring Yearly Meetings.

The Clerk being absent, Hugh Balderson
was appointed to serve the present meeting
in his stead.

The Committee continued at last meeting,
on the subject of the bequest of the late
Sarah Lane, Reported that no information
has yet been received in relation to it. They
were continued to the service.

The Committee appointed in the 3rd month
last, produced the following communication
addressed to the Meeting for Sufferings, of In-
diana Yearly Meeting, on the subject of Petiti-
oning the General Government for the abolition
of Slavery in the United States which was
approved, and the Clerk was directed to sign
and forward it to that meeting — viz

"To the Meeting for Sufferings of Indiana
Yearly Meeting,

Dear Friends

"Your communication of the 10th month
last, containing an invitation to us to unite
with you in petitioning the General Govern-
ment, on the subject of the Abolition of Sla-
very in the United States, was duly received,
