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At a Meeting for Sufferings held in Baltimore
the 11th of the 9th Month 1833.

Present 14 Members.

Joseph King Esq. was appointed to serve this Meeting
as Clerk, in consequence of the indisposition of the friend
who has acted in that capacity.

The Committee in the care of the bequest of the late
Sarah Land, not being prepared to report fully were
continued to the service.

The Committee appointed to take charge of the
distribution of 50 Copies of the Bible received from
Friends of Great Britain, made the following report, viz:

To the Meeting for Sufferings,

"Agreeably to our Appointment, we have distributed to
"Members of our Society within the limits of the Yearly
"Meeting, sixteen Copies of the Bible, being part of the
"donation received from Friends of Great Britain. of this
"number, nine Copies were distributed within the limits
"of Baltimore Quarter, and seven Copies within the limits
"within the limits of Nottingham Quarter.

"Information has been received from all of the
"Monthly Meetings in answer to the enquiries which
"were directed to them by this Meeting in the 10th Month
"last and the wants of Friends as far as ascertained
"by these Reports, supplied in the above distribution: but
"as the wants of Friends in several portions of the
"Yearly Meeting where at present Meetings are only
"held by indulgence are not embraced in these Reports,

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"the Committee look forward with interest to the
"establishment of Meetings for worship and Discipline
"at these places as furnishing an opportunity of
"obtaining further information on the subject, and we
"believe that a portion of the remaining thirty four
"Copies, might be usefully distributed in the course
"of another Year, under the direction of a Committee
"of this Meeting."

subject. They were continued.

Then Adjourned to meet at 7 O'clock in the evening
of Seventh day preceding our ensuing Yearly Meeting.
