The Committee appointed to take charge of 50 Copies
of the Bible, received from Friends of Great Britain, were
continued.

Hugh Batterson on behalf of the Committee appointed
to take the ~~subject~~ subject of the evils resulting from the
Lottery system, as now in practice in this State, reported
that they had had a conference, and that their deliberations
resulted in a judgment that it would be a safe step
for this Meeting to take, to Memorialise our State Legis-
lature at its next Session. With which report this Meeting
united, and the Committee are continued to prepare a
Memorial accordingly, and produced it to this Meeting in
the 12th Month next.

The Clerk informs that a copy of the Minutes has been
forwarded to Central Monthly Meeting, appointing Wm. A.
Thomas, and John Irwin Correspondents for said Meeting.
