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A communication addressed to this Meeting was received from the Meeting for Sufferings of Ohio, dated 14th of the 12th Month 1834, transmitting the information that Dr. John Unthank of the City of Limerick, in Ireland, had, in addition to other benevolent donations, granted the sum of £500. Sterling, to the Yearly Meetings of Ohio, Indiana, and Baltimore, to be applied by them through their Committee on Indian Concerns, in promoting the Civilization and Christianization of the Indians. This communication was read, and deliberated upon, and the proposition of the Meeting for Sufferings of Ohio, to appoint Samuel Parsons of Flushing, L.I. in the State of New York, is satisfactory to this Meeting, and we accordingly unite in his appointment, as our Agent, to receive the money, and give a receipt for the same, and to hold the Amount subject to the order of the Meetings for Sufferings of Ohio, Indiana, and Baltimore.

The Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this Minute to the Meeting for Sufferings of Ohio, and also to Samuel Parsons.

The following is a Copy of the Communication of the Meeting for Sufferings of Ohio, referred to in the preceding Minute.

To the Meeting for Sufferings of Baltimore Yearly Meeting.
Dear Friends,

At a Meeting for Sufferings held at Mount Pleasant, (Ohio) the 14th of the 12th Month 1834.

The following Communication was received by the hand of Elisha Bates on his return from Europe, which being read, and considered, the benevolent donation therein mentioned, was gratefully

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accepted, for the purposes intended by the donor. And Samuel Parsons of Flushing, Long Island, in the State of New York, being proposed as our Agent, was united with by the Meeting, and he is accordingly appointed, and authorized to receive from the said Denis Fitz Gerald Mahony, and Benjamin C. Fisher the £250. Sterling granted to the Boarding School of Ohio Yearly Meeting, and also the £500. Sterling given for Indian Civilization, so far as Ohio is concerned, and to give on behalf of Ohio Yearly Meeting, receipts for the same; and when the same is received, the said Samuel Parsons is to hold the Money subject to the order of the Meetings for Sufferings of Baltimore, Ohio, Indiana Yearly Meetings. And the Clerk is directed to forward a transcript of this Minute, and of the following Communication above alluded to, to the Meetings for Sufferings of Baltimore, and Indiana Yearly Meetings, requesting them to inform us when they shall have acted on the business. The Clerk is also directed to address a Letter to Samuel Parsons, on behalf of this Meeting, informing him of the liberty we have taken in appointing him to transact this business, requesting him to take charge of the same; and also to forward to him a copy of the foregoing Minute, &c.
