Present 13 Members.

Hugh Balderson on behalf of the Committee on the Bequest of the late Sarah Land, Reported, that no information had been received in relation to this case since last Meeting the Committee were continued.

H. Balderson on behalf of the Committee appointed to take charge of 50 Copies of the Bible received from Friends in Great Britain, informed that some further attention had been given to the subject since last Meeting, but that the Committee were not prepared to report fully - they were continued.

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The Committee on the subject of abolishing Lotteries made the following Report, which was accepted, and the Committee were continued to give such further attention to the subject as its importance may seem to require.

"The Committee on the subject of abolishing Lotteries have conferred together, and agreed to Report, that since last Meeting they have received a Copy of the Act passed at the last Session of the Legislature of the State of Maryland, which is as follows, viz:

"Laws of Maryland"
Chapter 219.

"An Act to alter and amend the Constitution."

Section 1. "Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,"
"That after the expiration of existing Lottery grants the Legislature of Maryland shall not pass any law authorizing the drawing of any Lottery, or the traffick or dealing in Lottery Tickets, or schemes or devices in the nature of Lotteries, or the distribution of money or property by chance."

Section 2. "And be it enacted, That all such parts of the Constitution and form of government, as are inconsistent with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed; provided, this act shall be published at least three months before a new election, and shall be confirmed by the General Assembly after the next election of Delegates, in the first Session after such new election, as the Constitution and form of government directs."
