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Joseph King Jr. on behalf of the Committee appointed to collect voluntary Contributions to aid our brethren in North Carolina in relation to the people of colour under their care, Reported that the sum collected amounting to \$124. had been drawn for by Ser^t. Hubbard and paid. The Committee were released.

A Memorial from Hopewell Monthly Meeting concerning Jonas Janney deceased, was received from Baltimore Quarterly Meeting held the 11th of the 6th Month 1835, which being read and Considered, it was concluded to appoint George Williamson, Will^m. Procter, Hugh Balderson, and Joseph Townsend, who were directed to examine and correct said Memorial, and report to next Meeting.

The following copy of a Minute was received from our Yearly Meeting, and the Clerk was directed to record the Memorial therein mentioned.

"At a Yearly Meeting of Friends held in Balt^o for the Western Shore of Maryland &c by Adjournments from the 27th of the 10th Mo. to the 30th of the same inclusive 1834,

"A Memorial concerning our late beloved friend Isaac Smith deceased, from Hopewell Monthly Meeting, approved by Balt^o Quarterly Meeting, was received through the Meeting for Sufferings which was read and approved, and directed to be returned to that Meeting to be recorded."

"Extracted from the Minutes ~~of the~~ of the Meeting aforesaid,
By Hugh Balderson
Clerk to the Meeting this Year."

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Joseph Townsend and Isaac Brooks were appointed to act in conjunction with the Clerk of this Meeting to examine the present New Book of Memorials, and if in their judgment it be not considered suitable to be continued for that purpose, that they obtain a new one, and call on the Treasurer of the Yearly Meeting for the Cost, and report to next Meeting.

A vacancy having occurred in Balt^o Quarterly Meeting's representation to this Meeting in consequence of the death of our friend Jacob Tyson, the Clerk is directed to inform the Quarterly Meeting thereof by a copy of this minute, in order that a nomination may be made to fill said vacancy.

The Meeting then Adjourned to meet on 7th day evening at 7 O'clock (preceeding our ensuing Yearly Meeting).

At a Meeting for Sufferings held in Baltimore the 24th of the 10th Mo. 1835.

Present 20 Members, also several Brethren from within the limits of Neighbouring Yearly Meetings. The Committee on the request of the Slave Sarah Lane were continued.

Hugh Balderson on behalf of the Committee appointed to take charge of 50 Copies of the Bible received from Friends in Great Britain reported that some further attention had been given to that subject since last Meeting, and that several
