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Copies of the Bible yet remain on hand. The Committee were continued.

The Committee on the subject of abolishing Lotteries in the State of Maryland were continued to the service.

The Committee to whom was refer'd for examination and correction the Memorial from Hopewell Monthly Meeting concerning our late friend Jonas Sanny deceased, attended to the duty of this appointment - the Memorial on being read, with a small alteration was approved, and directed to be forwarded to our ensuing Yearly Meeting.

The friends appointed to act in conjunction with the Clerk of this Meeting to examine the present record Book of Memorials &c, not being prepared to report the services performed were continued.

The following communications from the Meeting for Sufferings of Indiana Yearly Meeting were now received and read, - in reference to the ord and date of 10mo. 1. 1835 this Meeting approves the appointment of Ephraim Morgan of Cincinnati as the Agent to receive the money from Samuel Parsons of Flushing L. I. which the Clerk is directed to inform S. P. of by a copy of this Minute.
