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The Committee appointed at last sitting on the proposition from our Brethren of the Indiana Meeting for Sufferings. ~~Indiana Meeting for Sufferings~~ made the following report - which being read - was approved and the clerk is directed to transmit copies of the same to the Meeting for Sufferings of Indiana & Ohio yearly Meetings.

~~And to the Meeting for Sufferings~~
of Meetings. The Committee to whom was referred the communication from the Meeting for Sufferings of Indiana yearly Meeting relative to the funds entrusted to Baltimore yearly Meeting for the civilization of the Indian natives and now in the hands of the Separatists Report: that the funds in question were originally part of a large sum raised by friends in England and sent to Philadelphia Friends to be applied towards the civilization and Christian instruction of the Aborigines of our country. That Philadelphia friends divided the amount between the yearly meetings of Philadelphia New York & Baltimore. That the portion received by us was invested in productive stock in the name of three trustees for the use of the Indians. That after Ohio yearly Meeting was established and became jointly interested with Baltimore yearly meeting

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in the care of the Shawnee tribe then within their limits: the active duties of the concern were entrusted to them and they were authorized by Baltimore yearly Meeting to draw upon its trustees for the funds as they might be wanted. That since the separation in 1828 the surviving trustees Philip E Thomas & Isaac Tyson have ceased to pay any respect to the aforesaid agreement between the two yearly meetings. That this subject has claimed the anxious attention of our Committee on Indian concerns since 8mo 5. 1834. That a minute was then adopted by it requesting the said trustees to pay over to Joseph King Esq. Treasurer of the Committee the interest and dividends which had accrued thereon including the unpaid balance on hand at the yearly Meeting of 1837: also to transfer the principal to Joseph King & Daniel Cobb & Eliska & Brown to be held by them in trust to be applied under the direction of the yearly meeting to the purposes for which it was intended. That copies of this minute were furnished to Isaac Tyson and Philip E Thomas respectively together with a copy of a minute of the yearly meeting of Friends of London (1831) recognizing the body by whom our committee was appointed as the yearly Meeting of the Society of Friends held in Baltimore - to which no reply has been received.
