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having been made acquainted with the above facts have requested the said Trustees to make through us that disposition of the funds which they the donors originally intended but without avail.

That the amount of the funds in 8mo 1838 the latest account we have was probably about 12000 \$ principal & interest. That we have reason to believe that at their yearly meeting in 1840 & subsequently they the Separatists in direct violation of the compact above mentioned between the yearly meetings of Baltimore & Ohio subjecting these monies to the drafts of the Indian Committee of the latter have appropriated large sums out of them towards the establishment of a school &c among the Seneca Indians in the State of New York; having united with their brethren of New York, Germantown and Philadelphia in extending assistance to these tribes. That having been thus approached by our committee and by our friends of Great Britain without any effect when the funds were being unemployed in their hands we cannot believe when they are now appropriating them to other tribes of Indians under their own and their friends care that any further representations upon our part are likely to meet with any better success. That we are therefore united

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in believing that it will not be expedient for us to appoint the committee proposed by our friends of Indiana and that if they in connection with our friends of Ohio shall see fit to pursue the subject further under the compact entered into between Ohio & Baltimore yearly meetings that it be distinctly understood that it must be done upon their own responsibility.

For a more detailed statement of what steps have been taken in relation to this subject by our Indian Committee we would refer to a communication from it to the committee of Ohio & Indiana yearly meetings dated 6mo. 5 1841 which has been preserved on the records of our committee and copies of which were sent forwarded to the committees of Indiana & Ohio yearly meetings.
