To the Meeting for Sufferings

The Committee appointed to examine into & report upon the law of our late Legislature which directs the Sale of free persons of color who have been convicted of simple larceny, report that General Sales of convicts, under Statute law took place, when Thomas Mathews a free colored man convicted of stealing a watch, was sentenced to be sold out of the State for a period of five years. He carried his case by a writ of error to the court of appeals, which decided, that the judgement pronounced in his case was void, because he was not sold at public Sale, which is a condition of Sale, required by the act of Assembly. Since that time free persons of color, who have been convicted of larceny have been sent to the Penitentiary as heretofore.

Yesterday however the Criminal Court of Baltimore City, sentenced a free colored woman to be sold out of the State for two years & six months with special directions to the Clerk to enter on the docket "to be sold at public Sale," so as to avoid the error in the former case.

We believe however that sentencing a free person of color to be sold out of the State for a term of years is illegal, as the court

is placing the person beyond its own jurisdiction without any power over the convict at the expiration of the sentence
