To the Meeting for Sufferings

The Committee on the Lottery System of our State

Report - That at the opening of our Legislature
this winter the report of the Codifiers of the Laws
of Maryland was adopted entire, without opposition
it embraced a very stringent law against the Lottery
System, admitting however of an evasion of the pen-
alty. This defect was afterwards remedied by a severe
law of penalties & fines. As far as legal enactments
and the Constitution of our State are concerned every
thing has now been done to exterminate the System
from Maryland. It yet remains for the people to see
that the Law is not secretly violated, as is the case
in most other States. The Committee ask to be
released, with the understanding that we do not
as individuals lose sight of the Subject
