To the Meeting for Sufferings

By appointment in the 10th mo last I attended the late Yearly Meeting of N.C. & found Elijah Coffin there, with a minute from Indiana Yearly Meeting, under a similar appointment. We were closely united in the service & present a joint report & financial statement, a copy of which is herewith submitted, which fully sets forth the result of our examination & shows their debt to be about \$23,000.
