At a Mtg for Sufferings held in Balt<sup>d</sup> the 21<sup>st</sup> of 11 Mo 1863,  
present eleven members, which not being a quorum, it was con-  
cluded, in the emergency of the occasion, to act, & rely on a

The Clerk being absent Francis T. King was appointed for the day.
