

They had sold the Fair Hill farm, for about \$15,000 and the Pasture lots for about the same amount. Most of the latter on one and two years credit. They paid us \$3000, which has been placed with the Building Committee of Baltimore Monthly Meeting until the final Settlement. They are to pay us our proportion of all funds received.

The Committee to correspond with Friends of other Yearly Meetings in reference to the erection of a Meeting-house at Washington, D. C. was continued.

The following communication from the Representative Meeting of Nova Yearly Meeting in reference to the present of the Indian Traders was read, and James C. Thomas, Francis J. King and Rich^d W. Parney were appointed to co-operate with that Meeting, in the prosecution of their concern as may may appear & report to a future meeting.

"To the Meeting for Sufferings of Baltimore M. Mtg.

The present condition of the Indians has claimed our serious consideration, and after a full interchange of views we are united in appointing

David Morgan, Enoch Hoag, David Hunt and James C. Thomas, to labor for the formation of peace between the Indians and Whites, as well as the general protection of the Aborigines in all their rights, by Memorializing the proper authorities, or otherwise. They are also to labor for their civilization and Christianity, as may may appear for it.

We invite other Meetings for Sufferings to co-operate with us in the prosecution of the concern of this Meeting.
