The Subject of the recent Militia Law of the State of Maryland was brought before the Meeting, and Francis T. Spring was requested to place on our records the correspondence with the Adjutant General of the State in reference thereto.

Then adjourned to the stated time in the Third month next.

Genl. A. S. Berry. Dear friend. I avail
