South was continued.

was read informing us of the appointment of
Egbert Cary to fill the vacancy in that Meeting's
representation in this occasioned by the death of
our dear friend (Saml. P. Harland. His name
was decided to be entered on our list of Members.

hoped some measure will be adopted, extending
the benefit of Common Schools to the Colored children
of the Country.

The Committee on Education at the South
reported that the House of Representatives a Bill
providing aid for Common School Education, which
was now before the Senate — They were continued.
