The Committee appointed to prepare testimonies of disownment against Deborah Truhal. Harriet Hull. Sophia Brooks and Mary Dukehart. produced them a transcript being read they were approved and directed to be signed. being as follows. the same friends were continued to proceed as the discipline directs, in each case respectively and report to next Meeting.

Deborah Truhal has so far departed from the good order of our religious society as to associate herself with those who have separated from communion with the ancient society of friends. she has neglected the attendance of our religious Meetings and is in connection with Meetings not acknowledged by our Yearly Meeting; thus identifying herself with the seceders and wounding unity with their principles. having been visited and manifesting no disposition to acknowledge her deviation we therefore Disown her from Membership with us. Signed by direction of Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Women friends for the Eastern and Western Districts in unity with the Ancient Yearly Meetings of friends held the 10th day of the 4th Month 1834.

The report from men friends as referred from last meeting being again read and considered, and the meeting being of opinion that a committee of women would be useful to unite with men in the labour. Hannah Hopkins. Sarah Brooks. Elizabeth Robertson. Hannah Stapler. Parthenia Dukehart and Eliza Hopkins were appointed to the service.

The Committee appointed to treat with Priscilla Dore and others reported as follows. Viz. We have attended to the duties assigned us, and had a full opportunity with Priscilla Dore and Priscilla Abner who manifested no disposition to condemn their Deviation. We think that further labour in their cases would not be profitable, Elizabeth and Rachel Dore declined seeing us, and it being the judgement of this Meeting that they should be disowned the same friends were continued to unite with men friends in preparing testimonies of disownment against them if they should be no cause to forbear and offer them to next meeting.
