Preparative Meeting informed that Eliza Street (formerly Balderston)

and Elizabeth Sutton (formerly News) have had their marriage accomplished contrary to the order established in our society. Mary Robertson and Judith Williamson were named to visit them on the occasion and report.

The following minute from the preparative meeting of ministers and Elders was read, and after a time of soled deliberation thereon, was fully united with, the clerk was directed to unite with ministers in signing a minute expressive thereof to be forwarded to the Quarterly meeting of ministers and Elders.

At Baltimore preparative meeting of Ministers and Elders (in unity with the ancient Yearly meetings of friends) held by adjournment the 29th of 5th Mo 1834.

The appearances of our friend Hannah Mitchell in the ministry, having claimed the soled deliberation of this Meeting, and believing she had received a gift in the ministry and feeling unity with her in the exercise thereof it was concluded to offer the subject for consideration, to the monthly meeting. The clerk was directed to furnish that meeting with a copy of this minute.
