They endeavored to raise in her a sense of ^{the nature of} her errors, but she did not appear prepared to see or acknowledge them, the meeting upon solid deliberation is of the judgement that no benefit would be likely to result from delay in the case.

To the Monthly Meeting

The joint Committee of men and women friends appointed to visit delinquents in the attendance of our religious meetings have agreed to report that they have endeavored to act with a steady aim to the attainment of the object of their appointment: Although the fruits of their labors are not so manifest as could be wished, yet they indulge the hope that the love which has been evinced in this service may be as bread cast upon the waters that will be found after many days; it is with grief that we perceived that in several instances that the almost total neglect of our meetings arises from viewing this great duty with indifference, induced (in part) by the practice of attending ~~the~~ places of worship of other societies, and there ensues an almost utter disregard of the religious duties incumbent upon our members, such require
