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the subject, but were not in readiness to report, they were continued.

The committee in Miriam ~~Morris~~ case reported, that they were not prepared to report, they were continued.

The Representatives to the Quarterly meeting reported their attendance.

Then adjourned.

Two of the Representatives to the meeting attended.

The committee in Elizabeth Ann Gooch's case was continued.

The committee in Miriam Mercer's case report that they have had an interview with her, and it was their judgment that her request was made in sincerity but that they believed it would be best the case should be continued under the care of the committee to report when ready, which the meeting united with, and the same committee was continued with the addition of Dorothy Hopkins.

An Epistle of counsel from the late yearly meeting was acceptably read.

A report from the yearly meeting's committee appeared on the proposition from Baltimore Quarterly meeting for the adoption of a rule of discipline respecting the

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adult members of the separation, and not yet disowned, was introduced into this meeting in the minutes of mens yearly meeting, and the following friends were appointed to assist the overseers in dealing with the members of this monthly meeting, viz- Hannah Stapler, Dorothy Hopkins, Margaret Cheston and Clarissa Tussell.

Then adjourned.

At Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Women Friends (in unity with the ancient yearly meetings of Friends) held 3rd month 8th 1838.

One of the Representatives attended; for the absence of one of the others, a sufficient reason was given.

Baltimore Preparative meeting informed that Gadassah J. Moore and Phebe J. Davis, had individually separated themselves from communion with the ancient society of Friends; and had neglected the attendance of our religious meetings, and are in connexion with meetings not acknowledged by our yearly meeting; thus identifying themselves with the seceders, and evidencing unity with their principles, Hannah Stapler, and Parthenia Dukehart were appointed to pay the necessary attention to both cases.

The three usual queries were read, and the following answers directed to be forwarded to the Quarterly meeting. Louisa Landis, Sam Jones, Susanna Hopkins, and Margaret Balderston were appointed to attend the Quarterly meeting as our representatives.
