ted our representatives to the Quarterly Meeting.

A communication was received from Cesar's creek monthly meeting, in answer to our request to visit Esther E. Lanby, stating that they had given the necessary attention to the subject, & that they believed further labour would be unavailing. Jacy King & Hannah Stapler were appointed to join men friends in preparing a testimony of disownment.

Then adjourned.
