children into membership with which the meeting united and continued the same friends to inform her thereof.

A certificate for Ann G. Davis from Philadelphia Mo. meeting was read & accepted.

Mary A. Congdon requested a certificate to Providence Mo. meeting state of Rhode Island Margaret Chaston & Louisa Landis were named to prepare and produce one.

New York Mo. meeting informed that they had handed Mary Hall the testimony of disunion issued against her by this meeting.
