6th Ans. Friends generally maintain our testimony against an hiring ministry; we know of no ~~particular~~ deficiencies in respect to the other particulars of the query.

7th Ans. We believe Friends are careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances and mostly careful to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage and punctually

to comply with their engagements.

8th Ans. Friends appear careful to bear their testimony against slavery, and those of the African race under their care are suitably provided for, and some care taken to instruct them in useful learning.

9th Ans. Endeavors have been used to deal with offenders agreeably to discipline, and to revive to those who will not be reclaimed the spirit of meekness and love.
