4th

Our testimony against spirituous liquors appears to be maintained. Frequenting taverns or attending places of diversion discontinued. Moderation and temperance generally observed.

5th

The necessities of the poor are inspected and where we have none among us requiring assistance in their employment and no children to educate.

6th

Most Friends maintain a faithful testimony against a declining ministry. Observe of oaths, military service, clandestine trade, false goods and betting.

7th

Friends appear to be careful to live within the bounds of their circumstances and to avoid involving themselves in business beyond their ability to manage; just in their dealings and punctual in complying with their engagements.

8th

We believe Friends are careful to bear a testimony against Slavery. Those of the African race under Friends care appear to be suitably provided for and

receive some instruction in useful learning.

9th

Endeavors are used to deal with offenders reasonably and impartially and to advise to those who will not be reclaimed the spirit of meekness and love before they are disowned.
