The following report was read from the school Committee which was satisfactory to the meeting, the same Committee was continued.

First annual Report of Friends Academy, Eutan St,
Session 1875-6,

The school opened 9th mo 20th in the basement of the meeting house with Professor Lucius V Suttle Principal, Rebecca M Thomas Assistant, and 43 scholars. It was moved into the school house a few weeks later. This house has proved remarkably adapted for its purposes; the light, ventilation, and plans being with sole reference to its object as a school. At third teacher Addie Parham, and a drawing teacher were added during the year.

Instruction was given in the elementary branches of English, in history, mathematics, French, German, Latin, and Greek. The winter vacation extended from 12th mo 22nd to 1st mo 5th, and the spring vacation from 4th mo 5th to the 17th.

The attendance of our scholars has been required at our fifth day meetings.

The season closed 5th mo 21st with an attendance of 24 boys and 33 girls, in increase of 14 pupils over the beginning of the year. The Committee express themselves satisfied with the manner in which the school has been conducted, and feel that their design of giving children a thorough and solid education is being realized.

The report of the Committee to examine the treasurer's account is annexed.
