

the wall, and a rental of \$800 per annum has been paid by the Bryn Mawr School for the building, so that we are now in a better condition financially than ever before, and have been able to assist in the education of two of our members whom it seemed desirable to send to Westtown.

The School House caught fire in the cellar on the evening of the 13th of 3rd Mo. last and the damage resulting was estimated at \$389.⁹⁹. The necessary repairs were made at the expense of the Balto. Equitable Insurance Company in a manner entirely satisfactory to us and to the tenants.
