To Baltimore Monthly Meeting of Friends.

Dear Friends:

Our last report was dated 3rd mo. 1st 1888. The Bryn Mawr School for girls still continues to occupy the school house at a rent of \$800. per annum. We have expended for taxes and water rent \$257.⁶⁰ for repairs \$66.⁵¹, and for the education of members of the Monthly Meeting \$285.—: one scholar being aided to go to Westtown, and another to Guilford College, and another to Bryn Mawr College. The balance now in our hands is \$1283.²⁴, as will appear by the following statement, and is all deposited in the Central Savings Bank at 3 per cent interest.
