

posed of those who are active in carrying it on, and the chairman of these different committees, form an Executive Committee, having charge of the finances, and much work of detail. Much of our work is carried on ⁱⁿ the building known as Friends' Gospel Mission, on Light St. in South Baltimore.

The branches of the work are as follows:

Boys Meeting, a Bible school for boys, held on First day afternoons from 4 to 5 o'clock, having about 130 scholars and 18 teachers or officers, of whom 9 are members of this monthly meeting.

Sewing school for girls, held on Seventh day mornings, having about 150 scholars, and 19 teachers, beside an overflow room, where about 50 scholars receive oral instruction, while waiting admission to the regular school, where religious teaching is combined with instruction in sewing.

Mothers Meeting, held one afternoon in each week, with an average attendance of about 60, religious teaching

being a prominent feature of the work, while the women are given the opportunity to purchase garments at a low price, upon which they have done the sewing.

Household School, held two afternoons in the week with an attendance varying from 40 to 60; two regular teachers, being assisted occasionally by two or three others. In this school the girls are taught the duties pertaining to house keeping, cooking, setting table and caring for bed rooms.

Young Folks Union, having a care of the development of the social life among the young people attending the mission meeting. They have the care of the Library, opening the room two evenings in the week, and lending the members books for home reading. One or two classes are provided with instruction in different branches of study, simple entertainments are given, and occasional lectures.

Temperance work is carried on by several of our members, in various lines, and some of our workers are frequently
