To Baltimore Monthly Meeting.

The pastoral committee submit the following report, embracing the period since Eleventh month 1st. 1889.

In Baltimore Meeting, there has been a slightly increased attendance at First day evening meetings, and possibly on Fifth day. No material difference noticed in those on First day mornings. An increased interest is observable in our meetings, all of which have been very satisfactory, and we believe profitable to those who have attended. Occasional children's meetings have been held, with satisfactory attendance and interest. A number of visits have been made to those of our members, who have been unable to attend meeting on account of age or sickness, and letters have been written to several of our absent members

expressing our continued interest in them as fellow members, and making inquiry in regard to their present experience and feelings; some of whom have replied, expressing their gratification at the interest thus manifested in them, and their continued attachment to the Society.

At Federal Hill, the usual religious meetings have been regularly maintained as in previous years, namely, two on First day, and one on Fifth day, with an attendance varying from about twenty on Fifth day evening, to about seventy on First day evening. While the attendance is not larger than formerly, there appears to be a decided growth in religious life, and strength of character. Within the last few weeks there has been an evident work of the spirit upon the young people and children; a number of them have accepted the Saviour, and manifest a desire to serve Him. They have a prayer-meeting of their own before the regular First-day night meeting, which they find helpful and interesting.
