Report

Trustees

The following report of the Trustees was
read and approved, and that part re-
ferring to the establishment of a cooking
school in the mission building was left,
if way should open for it, to the judgment
of the Trustees.

To Baltimore Monthly Meeting:

The Trustees report that they have elected
James Carey Thomas as President of the
Board in place of Francis T. King, deceased.

They refer to the report of the Treasurer to
the Monthly Meeting in 1st month last,
for a financial statement for 1891 of the
various Funds under their care.

The School building erected by Thomas
Wilson has been rented to the Johns Hopkins
University for another year, at the same
rate, \$1000.- and the rent is being regularly
collected and deposited in the Central

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Savings Bank, except such sums as are drawn
by the Educational Committee of the Monthly
Meeting. \$2150.- of the surplus has been in-
vested in 1st. mortgage Bonds of the Consolida-
ed Gas Co. bearing 6%.

The income from the Schofield Fund is
being used to support a night school at
Federal Hill Mission, which has been doing
a good work the past few months.

The income of the M. K. Warden Fund goes
to the general mission work at Federal Hill,
in accordance with the terms of the bequest.

As it was found impossible to recover any
thing from the estate of Ann Eliza Hopkins,
without a lawsuit, the Trustees have de-
cided to let the matter drop.

Permission having been asked to hold a
cooking school in the Mission building, it
was decided to offer the use of the attic for
that purpose, and to recommend the
Monthly Meeting to have a room finished
off there for it, if it is found practicable.
