Lot on Light st. near Hamburg st. 56 ft. by 331 ft. bought in 2nd mo. 1871 at a cost of \$6,500.- (of which \$3000.- was contributed by Miles White) improved by a brick Mission house, 42 by 120 ft. built in 1880 at a cost of \$14,600.- including fencing, heating and furnishing: also by a janitor's house in the interior of the lot, and four small houses on the rear, fronting on James Alley, which are rented out to
