Association for Christian Work was read.

To Baltimore Monthly Meeting:

Friends Association for Christian Work submit the following condensed summary of the work of its committees during the past year.

The Federal Hill First day School was attended by an average of 9 teachers and 109 scholars, being less than usual, caused mainly by sickness. The Adult Bible Class taught by Joseph P. Elliott, and attended by 15 men, is an important feature. An afternoon session, for the younger children is held, but with the Adult Bible Class, is discontinued during the summer months. Several children professed conversions during a series of meetings that were held.

The Girls Sewing School had an attendance of about 250, but for lack of teachers, only about 100 could be taught, the balance being kept in an overflow room.

The Boys Meeting had an average attendance of 11 teachers, and 125 boys, being 14
