The school building erected by Thomas Wilson is rented to the Johns Hopkins University for another year at \$1000.- a year, and the rent is regularly collected, and deposited in the Central Savings Bank. A part of the income has been used by the Education Committee of the Monthly Meeting.

The income from the Sheffield Fund has been used to support a night school at Federal Hill. It was reopened last Tenth month and continued until the middle of the Fourth month, with an average attendance of 18, at a cost of \$75.⁶⁵ for the six months session.

The income from the M. H. Harder Fund goes to the general work at Federal Hill.

The Trustees have decided to invest \$1000.- of the accrued interest of the Wilson Fund in some good security, which, with the \$2000.- already invested in C. & B. Bonds of the Consolidated Gas Co. of Baltimore, will make \$3000.- besides the School Building.

There has been no change to note in regard

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to the real estate belonging to the Meeting, except that it has been found necessary to renew the iron caps to the chimney and ventilating stack at Friends Mission Building, Light st. costing \$151.⁹².
