Report of
Association
for Christian
Work.

The following satisfactory report of
Friends' Association for Christian Work
was read.

The Boys Meeting of Friends' Federal Hill
Mission was held from 10th mo. 9. 1892 to
4th mo. 2. 1893, with an average attendance
of 142 scholars. New hymn books were
purchased, and as the school was larger
than the previous year, we are encouraged
as to its success.

Friends' Bible School, Cutaw and Monument
sts. was held from 9th mo. 25. 1892 to 5th mo.
28th. 1893, with an average attendance of
52. The amount collected for Foreign

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Missions was \$41.⁶⁰, a decrease of \$1.⁴⁰ for the
same period in the previous year. By an
exchange of books with the Bible School at
Fishertown, Pa. many books new to our
scholars were put on the library shelves.

The Temperance Committee report progress.
The Mothers' Meeting on Federal Hill has been
very prosperous the past year. The average
attendance was 55: total 1168, and when we
realize that this means 1168 opportunities
offered for the reception of the Gospel, we feel
that the work is important. At the
closing meeting 24 women testified, and many
others desired prayer to be made for them.
It is desired that the work shall not be
cramped for the lack of funds.

The Girls Sewing School closed 4th mo. 15. 1893,
with an attendance of over 200. The want
of teachers has hindered the work, two or
three often having to look after a hundred
girls. It is hoped that friends will seri-
ously consider it, as the school has accom-
plished much good, one former scholar being
now a teacher of sewing in the public school.
